Case Study: Advancing Sustainability Objectives via Green Remediation

In 2015, the United Nations published 17 sustainable development goals. Part of one of these goals encourages "companies to adopt sustainable practices and sustainability reporting." Many organizations are doing just that by integrating and tracking green and sustainable successes in



their remediation programs. At the AEHS East Coast Conference in October, Sue Dugas (SURF Member, BSI Services and Solutions) described how all five EPA core elements of a greener cleanup were implemented at an 80-acre RCRA Corrective Action site. Equally important in this work was the community's involvement at every stage of work. The community fully supported the final remedy and even presented the company's plan at meetings. The *ASTM Guide for Greener Cleanups* was used to report the outcomes, which included 87 green best management practices (BMPs), nine social BMPs, and eight economic BMPs. The company received recognition for its green and sustainable work through a state award and an internal award.
