It's official! The Interstate Technology Regulatory Council (ITRC) has published guidance on *Sustainable Resilient Remediation* (SRR) (click <u>here</u>). In June 2019, SURF part-

nered with the ITRC to update the 2011 green and sustainable remediation guidance and include a strong resilience component to address the increasing threat of extreme weather events and wildfires. The new guidance includes:

- An interactive framework for integrating sustainability and resilience into the remedial project life cycle
- Case studies where SRR principles have been applied
- Tech sheets highlighting SRR activities in several states
- Checklists of sustainable best management practices
